Students are taught in mixed ability for the equivalent of six single lessons per fortnight. Projects are highly personalised and tailored to the individuals. They follow the OCR 9-1 Fine Art

Term 1&2: Coursework Portfolio	Term 3&4: Externally Set Task	Term 5:
Negotiated portfolio project working with students strengths fusing ideas from previous projects. Final piece is done under controlled conditions in Term 2 to give students a clear understanding of the process they will go through for the outcome of their Externally Set Task. Once this is completed work is refined and presented so that the project is coherent. The coursework portfolio forms 60% of the overall grade. <b>Prior Learning:</b> builds on work started in year 10. <b>OCR 9-1 :</b> All assessment objectives covered. Realise personal intentions through the sustained application of the creative process <b>Curriculum Intent:</b> Students are equipped to create personal projects that exploit opportunities to engage with deep themes. Combining this with practical skills, for example different approaches to recording techniques, enable all learners to find their strengths. Students are empowered to develop work which is highly skilled and imaginative.	<ul> <li>Students respond to the current exam theme released by the exam board in January.</li> <li>Students will use their strengths and skills to work towards creating a portfolio that centres around a personalised concept relating to the exam theme.</li> <li>The externally set task forms 40% of the overall grade.</li> <li>Prior Learning: Materials, techniques and processes used previously are now exploited.
