<p>Prior learning: Students may be able to use the knowledge and skills that they have acquired at KS2 learning a modern language. They will be able to make links to their knowledge of English grammar.</p> <p>National Curriculum. Introduction to German pronunciation and intonation. Grammar focus on articles, adjectives and present tense endings.</p> <p>Curriculum intent: Develop the ability to introduce yourself and give basic information about yourself.</p>	<p>Prior learning: Students expand their knowledge of <i>haben & sein</i> to include different persons.</p> <p>National Curriculum: Express and develop ideas and give and justify opinions. Grammar focus on the present tense and the use of the infinitive with <i>kann</i>.</p> <p>Curriculum intent: Develop a wide vocabulary on the topic of family and understanding of grammatical concepts, including the high-frequency verbs <i>haben & sein</i> and using the modal verb <i>kann</i> with the infinitive verb at the end of the sentence.</p>	<p>Prior learning: Students reinforce their knowledge of present tense verb endings.</p> <p>National Curriculum: Use and manipulate key grammatical structures and patterns. Identify and use tenses and other structures which convey the present and future appropriately.</p> <p>Curriculum intent: Develop a wide vocabulary on the topic of freetime and understanding of grammatical concepts, including regular and irregular verb conjugations in the present tense, and using the present tense to refer to future plans.</p>	<p>Prior learning: Review and recap on giving opinions, genders of nouns, possessive adjectives and modal verbs.</p> <p>National Curriculum: Use accurate grammar, spelling and punctuation. Express and develop ideas clearly and with increasing accuracy, both orally and in writing. Listen to a variety of forms of spoken language. Speak coherently and confidently, with increasingly accurate pronunciation and intonation.</p> <p>Curriculum Intent: Enable students to communicate confidently on a growing range of topics, applying their wide vocabulary and grammatical knowledge.</p>	<p>Prior learning: Make links with verb endings and use of the infinitive, knowledge of genders and articles.</p> <p>National Curriculum: Identify and use tenses and other structures which convey the present and future appropriately. Make use of important social conventions such as formal modes of address.</p> <p>Curriculum Intent: Manipulate language and develop cultural understanding. Students develop a wide vocabulary and become confident in using vocabulary from previous topics, as well as developing their grammatical knowledge to enable them to become more independent with their use of the language.</p>
