Firstly, I would like to thank you and your school and students for taking part in the recent Youth Mayor Elections.

The event was hugely successful. There were over 10,000 ballot papers issued for secondary pupils across 17 school and college venues. There were more than 7,000 votes cast, resulting in a 70% turnout.

In comparison, a normal Local Election across the city would have a turnout of 35%. We really appreciate the opportunity to engage with so many schools and young people across the city in encouraging them to experience the voting process. It all helps students to understand and take part when they are eligible to vote in traditional elections themselves on reaching 18.

The result of the Youth Mayor Election for 2018/19 is as follows:

The 2018/19 Youth Mayor will be Frederico, a Student at Bemrose School. The Deputy Youth Mayor will be Sonja, a Student at Derby College

Many congratulations to both candidates. They will take up their new roles when they are formally appointed at the Council's Annual Meeting in May 2018.

We look forward to working with you all again for the 2019/20 Youth Mayor Election. We will begin preparations for that in October.


